- On October 2<sup>nd</sup>, the Historical Society had a meeting in the Historic Big Pines Lodge with 65 in attendance.


## **Angeles National Forest Closure Modified**

**Arcadia, CA –** On October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009, a new Station Fire Closure order was issued. The Closure was modified in pursuant of Order No. 01-09-08.

The Order is effective from 6:00 am October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2009 until September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2010.

The Wrightwood area, Blue Ridge, Big Rock Creek and Hwy 2 to Vincent Gap have been lifted from the closure.

The closure will continue to affect the Station Fire Recovery Area of the Angeles National Forest.



### "Sheep" Fire Causes Evacuation of Wrightwood



Wrightwood, CA – On Saturday afternoon on October 3<sup>rd</sup>, at 2:11 pm a fire would start near Applewhite Campground in Lytle Creek and quickly advanced in the direction of Wrightwood by way of Swarthout and Lone Pine Canyons.

The entire town came

under a Mandatory Evacuation order on Sunday morning as the fire quickly moved toward the east end of town. This is believed to be the first time ever the town has had to be evacuated.

Firefighters were able to make a stand at the top of Lone Pine Canyon and keep the fire from damaging any Wrightwood residences.

The "Sheep" fire would eventually consume some 7,200 acres before being contained.

Fire-fighters were able to use the event to set backfires and burn out areas near Helicopter Hill, Circle Mountain and the Levels area that have long been a concern because of very thick brush.



## **Deer Season Opens**



**D**eer Season opens in Zone D-11 on October 10<sup>th</sup> and will run until November 8<sup>th</sup>. Bag and possession limit is one buck, forked horn or better per tag. Deer tags CAN be validated by the U.S. Forest Service.

Tagging Requirements: After taking a deer the hunter is required to immediately fill out and permanently mark the date of the kill (notch tag), and attach the tag to

the antlers. A maximum of 5,500 tags will be issued for this zone.

Archery Season runs from September 26<sup>th</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup> and either sex may be taken. Only 1,000 Archery tags are issued.

For the last two years CDFG Game Wardens have been very visible in our area of the forest and the Camp Lupine area which is a favorite of hunters. Due to the closure of much of the ANF, our area may be very crowded this year with hunters.

Hunting is illegal within 150 yards of a campsite, road, building, etc., but a much larger area is restricted from firearms in the Big Pines area. Check out the Los Angeles County Firearms Closure Map:

#### Volunteers Help with Forest Improvements

**V**olunteers have been busy making improvements to the campgrounds in our area of the Angeles National Forest.

#### Improvements:

- Bob Moore and Aaron Katona installed a new trash bin at Vincent Gap and prepared a pad for another one to be installed at Jackson Lake.
- Arnie Trejillo along with Bob Moore repaired the stairs on the observation tower at Jackson Flat. It is now safe for public use.

- Clark Fletcher has revamped and organized the workshop located at the Mt. High West Entrance.
- Planks and the bridge have been repaired at the Mescal Picnic area.
- Clark Fletcher and Aaron Katona are working on a proposal to build a wood deck and stairs on the East side of the Big Pines Visitors Center so as to cover exposed rebar and make the area useful.
- 15 minute Parking signs will soon be installed in front of the station.

### Concessionaire Campgrounds Close Early

Big Pines – CA The campgrounds operated by concessionaires, including Table Mountain, Mountain Oak, Lake and Jackson Flat, are all closed for the season.

Typically these campgrounds stay open until November 15<sup>th</sup>, but it was decided they should close for the season when the Forest Closure took effect on September 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2009 due to the Station Fire.

Other Forest Service Campgrounds such as

Apple Tree, Pevine, Blue Ridge, Guffy and Lupine remain open.

## Wrightwood CERT Class Offered Again

Wrightwood – CA We dodged a very big "missile" by avoiding any damage from the "Sheep Fire" which stopped just short of the village. But wildfire is not the only potential catastrophe that threatens the community of Wrightwood, as it straddles the San Andreas Fault.

The Wrightwood Disaster Preparedness Team periodically sponsors the excellent disaster training program known as CERT (Community Emergency Response Team), which has graduated over 200 local folks over the last 3 plus years.

The next series of classes is scheduled for the Saturdays of October 31<sup>st</sup>, November 7<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>, from 9am to 4pm and will be held at the Sunrise Church, 770 Highway 2. Registration is required so as to plan for course

materials and the free CERT backpack, helmet and vest. CERT will again be participating in the WWGGDE event this year on October 24th.

### Confusion between ANF and BDF Forests

On Sept. 26<sup>th</sup> a group of some 45 individuals who were part of a "hiking club" were stopped and questioned when they were found to be hiking the Acorn Trail which is within the boundary of the September forest closure. The group was transported to near the Acorn Trailhead in Wrightwood via a bus, and many hiked the Acorn trail up to Blue Ridge Road and back.

In talking to the group's leader it was apparent that there was confusion as to the boundary of the forest closure. The leader felt that since they were hiking in the San Bernardino National Forest, the closure did not include the

Acorn Trail. This is a common misconception and no citations or warnings were issued. The San Bernardino National Forest that surrounds Wrightwood is administrated by the ANF, as clearly shown on maps.

### Fire Danger Level is Raised to "EXTREME"



The Fire Danger Level on the Angeles National Forest was raised to "Extreme" (Level 5 of 6) from "Very High" (Level 4) on October 1st, 2009.

- Campfires are NOT allowed anywhere in the Forest.
- Propane, gas or jelled stoves are ONLY allowed in developed sites. No Permit is required.
